Alternatively, taxis are also available from the airport if you prefer a more direct route.

Spend tonight at your leisure. Head out to explore and get your first taste of Tokyo by finding something to eat or going for a drink. We will explore more of the city tomorrow morning so no need to rush!

Friday 18 October

Tokyo

Start your day with a complimentary breakfast in the hotel restaurant.

Our first day in Tokyo will kick off with a half day sightseeing tour.

Today's highlights include a trip up the Tokyo Skytree for unbeatable city views as well visiting the historic neighborhood of Asakusa. The rest of the afternoon is all yours. The All Blacks will no doubt want to put on strong performances throughout the pool stages to secure top spot in Pool B and carry that momentum into the business end of the tournament. Pool A is one of the most unpredictable in the tournament. Ireland, Scotland and host nation Japan are all in contention to finish strong within their pool. With a capacity of just under 50,000 Tokyo stadium will be buzzing on game night. The Japanese are passionate about their rugby meaning there is no doubt this will be a sellout. You are about to experience one of the most unique atmospheres in world rugby!

After taking in all the sights we will return to the hotel and you can spend your evening at leisure.
