Monday 28 October

Hiroshima

Today is a travel day to Hiroshima. Once we arrive in Hiroshima we will check-in to our hotel where we will stay for the next three nights.

Hiroshima Prefecture is located in the southwestern part of the Japanese islands. It is rich in natural beauty of the Inland Sea and the Chugoku Mountains. Much of Japans landscape is characterized within this region presenting a refreshing alternative to the hustle and bustle of Tokyo.

Hiroshima is one of the most historically significant cities within Japan and to an extent, the world. Despite its dark legacy Hiroshima is quickly becoming a vibrant destination to visit. Friendly picturesque and a paradise for foodies, this city will continue to surprise you at every turn.

Tuesday 29 October

Hiroshima

Today we will explore one of the most iconic destinations in Japan, Miyajima. While this name may not ring any bells, there is no doubt you have seen the hundreds of images of The Great Torii. Miyajima Island, one of the most scenic spots in Japan, has long been regarded as an island of Gods on the beautiful Seto Inland sea. It is a romantic and historical island where Itsukushima Shrine, a World Heritage site is located, along with the virgin Forest of Mt. Misen along with numerous preserved shrines, temples and historical monuments.

You will also have the opportunity to ascend Mount Misen. As the highest mountain on Miyajima island, Mt Misen is more than 535m above sea level. Once you reach the top you will be greeted with incredible panoramic views stretching for as far as the eye can see.

Wednesday 30 October

Hiroshima

Today we will visit the Atomic Bomb Dome and the Hiroshima Peace Memorial, a true highlight of the tour.

At 8:15am on 6th August 1945, the first atomic bomb in history was dropped on Hiroshima. Although the Atomic Bomb dome was located almost directly underneath the explosion, it somehow avoided complete destruction and still remains in tact to this day. The site was designated a world heritage site in 1996 and acts as a reminder of the horrors of war whilst also representing the true value of peace.

Thursday 31 October

Tokyo

Today we will travel back to Tokyo where we will spend the last three nights of the tour.

This evening we will be joined by a huge contingent of All Blacks fans at the Official All Blacks Tours Eve of Final Function. We will be celebrating the tournament to date as we build up to the all-important Rugby World Cup final. Tokyo will be buzzing over finals weekend as rugby fans descend on the city. The evening presents the perfect opportunity to mix and mingle with other All Blacks fans as well as some very special guests
