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Monday 28 October

Sapporo

Today is a travel day as we fly to Sapporo. Once we arrive in Sapporo we will check-in to our hotel where we will stay for the next three nights.

Sapporo will provide you with a refreshing perspective and new appreciation for this beautiful country. Famous for its beer and snow festival Sapporo is thriving urban city full of unique character. It has an incredible food scene, stylish cafes, neon-lit nightlife, shopping galore – and then some.

This afternoon's activity will see the group head to the Sapporo Beer Museum. Sapporo Beer Museum, the only beer museum in Japan, was opened in July of 1987 to provide visitors with a varied knowledge of beer and brewing. Renovated in 2004, the exhibition allows guests to learn easily about the history of Sapporo Breweries Ltd. and the beer industry in Japan. No trip is complete without a bit of sampling of the famed product.

We will then return to the hotel and this evening is at your leisure.

Tuesday 29 October

Sapporo

We will spend today exploring the charming district of Otaru, a city known for its glassworks, music boxes and sake distilleries. This morning highlights include the Otaru Canal, Kitaichi Glass Otaru and the Otaru Music Box Museum.

Otaru Canal was a central part of the city's busy port in the first half of the 20th century. In 1980 it was restored at the request of the locals and now boasts some quirky cafes and shops inside of old warehouse buildings. The canal makes for a pleasant stroll during the day, when artists present their works to passing tourists, as well as during the evenings when old-fashioned gas lamps are lit and provide a romantic atmosphere.

We will then head to the famous Otaru music box museum. Characterised by its creaking wooden floorboards, shining ornaments, and ever-present twinkling of intricately designed music boxes; Otaru Music Box Museum feels almost a homey escape to the nineteenth century Swiss Alps. The museum and store space is spread across a number of buildings around the Ironai-dori area, which in all contains over 25,000 music boxes! After this we will take a break for lunch .

After lunch we will make a trip to Nikka Whiskey Yoichi Distillery. Nikka Whisky, one of Japan's top whisky makers, has its main distillery in, the neighboring town of Otaru. Learn how founder Masatake Taketsru used his experiences in Scotland to influence and establish Nikka as one of the top whiskey brands in the country along with the opportunity to see how it is made, and of course, grab a taste!
